III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- A. Approval of minutes for the November 29, 2018 Regular Session and Executive Session.
 - 1. A MOTION WAS MADE BY MEMBER FINK AND SECONDED BY MEMBER IOSUA TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR SESSION. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.
 - 2. A MOTION WAS MADE BY MEMBER IOSUA AND SECONDED BY MEMBER UCHIYAMA TO APPROVE THE EXECUTIVE SESSION MINUTES. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

IV. Monthly Reports

A. Chairman's Report

Chair Yamasaki stated, on today's agenda, we will have only one item for discussion and action -- to form our legislative committee in preparation for the upcoming Legislative Session.

The Chair said we continue to wind down our activities at the stadium and expressed his appreciation to Manager Chan and staff during this busy season.

B. Stadium Manager's Report (attached)

Events

- Tickets will go on sale today at the box office for the Monster Truck event scheduled for May, 2019. To date, online sales have amounted to approximately 14,000.
- Tomorrow tickets will go on sale for Eminem, scheduled for February 2019, and approximately 7,000 tickets were sold during the presale.
- We anticipate a very good showing for both events.

- We also have the SoFi Hawaii Bowl (UH vs. Louisiana Tech) on Saturday, December 22, 2018, and we anticipate an attendance of approximately 30-35,000. The stands in the upper levels will be closed, and will only be opened per the client's request.
- Manager Chan said he has provided a summary of the events that occurred (or will occur), and said he noted to his staff that there is nowhere in Aloha Stadium's history where seven (7) major events occurred in one month, let alone in one year. A tremendous effort was required in order for us to manage these events; and each event averaged an attendance of approximately 27-30,000 fans. It was quite an achievement by our staff. I want to recognize our staff for an outstanding job throughout the month of December.

Administrative

- Manager Chan noted his monthly report is attached and he will cover a few items from that report.
- A <u>Request to Travel</u> was submitted to visit a couple of sites relative to the upcoming Request for Proposal and the development of our facility; unfortunately the request was not granted (see attached letter from Comptroller, explaining the reasons why it was not approved).
- Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR): We are proceeding with the administrative rules - I provided you with an update in my report.
- The legislative session will convene in January 2019, and our first informational briefing with the Senate Ways & Means Committee is scheduled for January 14, with the House Finance Committee Budget Hearing to follow.
- We concluded our annual audit exit meeting in December and I am pleased to announce that we received a clean report. Manager Chan provided the board with a quick summary and noted that a copy of the report is available for board members upon request.
- One of our long-time faithful and dedicated employees, (Roy DeLeon, General Services Supervisor) is retiring at the end of this month, after 29 years of service he will be sorely missed.

- <u>Field Condition:</u> Engineer Vitale reported that he received a written report from AST (Applied Surface Technology) that our field has met the required standards to certify performance/safety clearance. He stated, we will continue to do these inspections after a concert is held and also prior to the UH Football Seasons.
- Request for Out-of-State Travel: Member Uchiyama stated that the reason for denial of this request by the Comptroller does not make sense and he does not understand how he can deny this request, because the operations and marketing go hand-in-hand, and it is necessary for the board to: 1) See what its competition is doing; 2) To learn the new technologies and trends that are happening in marketing a facility and venue like Aloha Stadium. Member Uchiyama also expressed concerns that "we are not on the same page" and are at a crossroad in not only looking at an existing facility, but in the planning process for a new facility. He questioned "How will the Board gain greater knowledge and how will we optimize what we are doing for the State?"

Additional Comments by Board Members and Others (names identified by initials) (RY) That is a very good and relevant question. We do have to follow up with his denial with regard to the question and I am having conversations with the AG's office to better understand how we can address his concern.

- (DU) What's concerning is the last sentence in the denial letter. "If the trip doesn't fall under the powers and duties of the Stadium Authority, where does our authority actually go?"
- (JF) Which includes promotion and marketing of the stadium -- I think that would be the purpose of the trip.
- (MI) Suggested the board respond by: 1) Clarifying its duties and limitations; 2) Under what authority does he have to deny the S.A. request to utilize its funds.
- (RY) Per our concern, the question would be what is the proper way to address this and perhaps it should be done by the Governance Committee. He stated the intention of the Governance Committee is to create a proposed resolution to come before the board at the next meeting and get that done. RY suggested to Counsel RN that this might be something that could be put in the resolution -- he also asked Counsel for recommendations on how to process this.
- (MI) In line with the Chair's question, MI asked Counsel, "What would be the process for requesting an official interpretation of what the Stadium Authority duties are?"

- (RN) The board would make a request to the Comptroller.
- (RY) Is that something that we would put together and propose for the next agenda, or is that something we are allowed to do in this process?
- (RN) You would be prudent to notice it for the next meeting agenda.
- (MI) We could get an opinion from the Comptroller on what he believes his authority to deny this request is, but ultimately, I believe it is the Governor (through executive order) that would determine the interpretation of that statute, not the Comptroller.

(Stephen Lee - arrived @ 8:48 a.m.)

- (JF) It also could be suggested that it's the Comptroller's responsibility to determine the authority and powers of the Stadium Authority -- Chair said unfortunately he is not at this meeting to answer that.
- (RY) Per Counsel's recommendation, we will add to the January meeting agenda the board's request for Counsel to have that answered.
- (JF) Inquired if it can be a simple request so that we don't spend an additional month after we meet next month. (RY) Yes, Counsel (RN) can help us and we will take it up with the Governance Committee to assist.

(RY) Specifically to (DU's) question regarding the process:

- 1. Prior to going through the process, it was my understanding that we are specially funded and it was in line with our rules and responsibilities.
- Before making the request he made some inquiries to make sure we had enough funds (we're not requesting for funds for this travel) and it was in line with specific events.
- 3. He recalls with former Chair Toguchi, the board had always looked for opportunities to educate ourselves, relative to the market we serve and the market we are trying to get events from. The difficulty was not being able to visit the sites when they were operating, due to our peak period (although there were multiple opportunities, none of them materialized because of conflicting schedules). However, this season a couple of windows fell in line and everything materialized with the help of our consultant, Irwin Raij, who had some contacts and some openings to allow us to meet with certain people to

better understand the mixed-use development, and the stadiums; as well as in L.A. there were opportunities to actually see how the Bruno Mars concert impacted L.A. Live. Additionally, we were in heavy talks with the Rams. It was an opportune time and we felt it was worth pursuing; thus, we did our due diligence, we checked on the funding from our operations and it was justified -- it was my understanding that it was just a matter of submitting it to the Comptroller to sign off. The questions are logical ones and per the Board's recommendations, we will address this at the next meeting.

(KA) Suggested, for the future, perhaps we can tailor our requests to satisfy what our duties are.

(HM) We should definitely clear up this situation. In order to create high-quality service for the people of Hawaii to experience different types of things, he recommends that it become mandatory for the Authority make 3-5 visits to different sites. There is no way anyone here is going to understand it until you go there to see these things and look at the logistics and get an understanding of it all.

The Chair asked Manager Chan to further explain the process.

(SC) He wants the Board to understand that the Stadium Authority is a special funded program attached to DAGS. Technically, and procedurally, all requests must seek DAGS Comptroller's approval. It has been difficult to get others to understand the level of authority and what truly is the function/responsibility of the board.

(MI) He thinks that is understood. His concerns are:

- 1. We have a single department that is basically deciding on policy level issues, (and maybe not just this), but it would be good to have clarification on when a request is made from an agency (not a division within the department -- a separate agency) to spend resources a certain way, what power is granted to DAGS to be able to deny them -- and it goes more than just this trip.
- 2. Even money that has been appropriated legislatively and assigned by the Governor (a budget item that is basically delayed or denied to a certain extent by a single department is really concerning to me). It has all sorts of constitutional issues and separation of power issues which I think it would be good to get clarification; and if it comes down to "yes" DAGS needs to approve every dollar that we spend and they have the right to deny any request then that is what we have to live with. In the meantime, that's not my understanding

and I think we've researched this issue in the past and I think this is an over-reach by that department.

(AA) Stated maybe Counsel Nishiyama can help with this:

Concerned that since this statute was written, things have evolved over the years with the interpretation of stadium and related facilities. We have 100 acres here and now we are looking at redevelopment, multi-use development, so how is he interpreting it -- it seems like we are in charge of the stadium, but actually the 100 acres of land here for multi development, residential, hotels, commercial and the ancillary development is so much greater return than the stadium can get in capital investment. They can generate a much bigger return than we can, typically; so as a stadium we have to look at that -- how do we support the stadium with all the development around it in the 100 acres. This statute was written when all of this wasn't happening. How he is interpreting it today is like 40 years ago - we are now looking at a whole different vision for the stadium -- so what is the interpretation of a stadium -- it does consist of 100 acres.

Counsel Nishiyama said one option would be to amend the existing stadium statute to specifically provide for development or redevelopment of the facilities.

- (JF) Inquired if the reason for asking for the Comptroller's approval was just a courtesy? He also inquired why the stadium can't include the travel expenses in their budget stating the purposes of planning, promotion and marketing of the stadium.
- (RY) He is with the understanding that it is the Stadium Authority's responsibility to come up with that, but the Comptroller has the responsibility to approve all out-of-state travel.
- (AA) How difficult is it to amend the statute?

The Chair said these are all valid and good points but at this time we will table the issue. He requested that Member Iosua (IAC Chair) work with him on the Governance Committee side and collectively have discussions with Counsel Nishiyama to create a position and background for next month's agenda.

Member Abe added, as we move further into the development, I think this will keep coming up when we need funding -- not just for travel.

Chair Yamasaki said correct; and to Member Minn's point, the Chair said he has always been in a the position where we need to take responsibility for what's

within our scope and we are all here serving our mission to provide great opportunities. He believes it is logical to want to have the understanding to perform our responsibilities, but the impression we all have right now is, "Well, what is our scope and authority then?" Chair said we will pursue that at our next meeting with our request, along with the formation of our resolutions.

Member Minn asked the Chair, "Would it not be more creditable if we have trips that allow this type of experience within our budget, instead of a side request? Chair said that is a valid point, but just keep in mind, we pushed a \$9.2 million budget and we are operating at a \$7.5 million budget. Therefore, a lot of times those are the things that start getting cut off first before we start cutting off.

Member Fink agreed putting it in the budget,

Chair said, logic wise, yes but there is a lot to take care of with an aging stadium. This was a great discussion and we will follow up with that.

Member Amemiya, quick question, I wasn't here at the last meeting. Tell me again, what's the proposed amendment to the HAR that is in Manager Chan's report.

Deputy Manager Andrews responded:

- Changes of how we can accept payments at the stadium (i.e. credit cards).
- Collection of non-refundable deposits for certain events.

Member Amemiya requested the status of the EIS. Manager Chan said it will be discussed as an agenda item by DAGS.


