# III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A MOTION WAS MADE BY MEMBER MORIOKA AND SECONDED BY MEMBER ABE TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR SESSION. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

2. Regular Session - September 24, 2020

A MOTION WAS MADE BY MEMBER FINK AND SECONDED BY MEMBER MORIOKA TO ACCEPT THE MINTUES OF THE REGULAR SESSION. THE MOTION WAS UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

### IV. MONTHLY REPORTS

A. Chairman's Report – Chair Yamasaki stated that with the Stadium Authority being a special funded program, we must generate our own operational revenue. Chair and Manager Chan have had daily conversations to keep up to date with administration and see what opportunities are available under the current restrictions.

Chair signed up for a summit hosted by Colosseum Global Sports Venue Alliance. The take away was that this is a global challenge in the entertainment industry, and, everyone is trying to adapt to today's challenges.

- B. Stadium Manager's Report Manager Chan stated that the stadium has tried to maximize opportunities during the pandemic with the following:
  - Haunted house drive-through sold out for 14 nights
  - Trunk or Treat sold 2000 units with 35+ sponsors
  - Covid surge testing

- Supporting food distribution efforts
- Swap Meet added food trucks for a six-week trial
- Rent-A-Car storage
- Christmas Light drive through event starting November 27th

- 2. Marketing Manager Samantha Spain Reported:
  - a. The Trunk or Treat event has 35 booths ranging from car dealerships to local mom and pop stores. There will also be Hawaii Stage and Lighting to light up the stadium. The event sold out within a week and has great support from the community.
  - b. Dine and Shop is a new venture in partnership with Hawaii News Now. This has given us free advertising for the swap meet in addition to segments on HI Now.

  - Committee Chair's Report Member Iosua stated the IAC did not convene this month.
     The reports were sent out and Chair asked if there were any questions regarding the reports. There were no questions.

  - 6. Ad Hoc Committee Stadium Revenue Opportunities Member Abe began by reading her report, and then stated that she should submit her report since it is lengthy. Chair asked her to summarize in the meantime. After experiencing some technical difficulties, Member Abe resumed her report:

One of the major obstacles is the Centerplate contract covers the entire stadium area, however she believes there are exceptions. Member Abe is not sure how many extra vendors are allowed at the swap meet, so she would like to take a closer look at the contract. She would like to know how flexible Centerplate is with the contract since they oversee the events such as the swap meet. She's not sure if the contract can be viewed as a force majeure since the pandemic is so severe, and maybe the contract can be altered or terminated. Member Abe recommended a review committee on this contract

between the attorney general and management to see what options we have for revenue generation. Member Abe asked Manager Chan if she is on the right track. Manager Chan stated that he spoke to Member Abe regarding several contract requirements and the HAR procedures that must be enforced. It is not as simple as it may seem to meet the expectations of others that do not comply with the current understanding or agreement. Member Abe is questioning the process because she has been tasked with maximizing revenue opportunities during these challenging times.

Member Iosua proposed to push back Member Abe's report an additional month based on the need for additional information.

Member Abe agreed with Member Iosua and had a few more added comments. She stated she recently visited the swap meet, and aside from the contract, she believes that there are a lot of areas that need improvement. Member Abe said the layout and flow of the swap meet needs to be re-evaluated to attract more quality vendors. Member Abe provided pictures of rummage type vendors compared to "clean organized vendors", and a reputable food truck vendor. She was slightly disappointed at what she experienced and thinks the layout should be considered. She feels that certain vendors should be sectioned off, and the food vendors should be together. She concluded that she has some ideas, however they would be subject to the restrictions of the contract.

Chair Yamasaki responded that the report can be given at the next board meeting, and there might be some clarity given in the executive session when contracts will be addressed.

There has been progress with the consultant team. They are reviewing the final draft of the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). If it can be expedited, the draft EIS will be published [and incorporates the Programmatic Master Plan] before the end of the year. We are fully coordinating our legislation with administration and the legislature and finalizing the language, so it can be introduced and ready to go this coming session. Lastly, we just fully executed a memorandum of agreement with Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA) under Act 268 and they continue to be supportive of all our efforts to keep the project moving forward.
