B. LEGISLATIVE

- 1. The Legislative Session concluded on May 5, 2022. Two keys bills were passed by the legislature that impact the Stadium Authority. Both bills have been sent to Governor for approval or veto (line item veto for HB1600).
 - a. SB3334 Transfers the Stadium Authority from being an attached agency of the Department of Accounting and Generals Services to being attached to the Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). This bill also clarifies the make-up of the Stadium Authority Board and adds the Director of DBEDT as a voting member of the Stadium Authority board. The intention of this bill is to aggregate enterprise agencies and land management functions under one department. This bill also amends Act 268, SLH 2019, Section 6, to reduce the GO Bond appropriation from \$170M down to \$20M to address existing expenditures and obligations to consultants.
 - b. HB1600 Budget bill appropriates \$350M to the Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (BED142) to fund stadium district redevelopment and an additional \$50M, of which \$49.5M is deposited into the Stadium Development Special Fund by Proviso Section 17.3 for the costs of operations, maintenance, and contract costs to developers of the stadium. The balance of \$500,000 in general funds remains in the Stadium's operating budget with a lapse date of 06/30/23. This bill also deletes 14.00 permanent positions in alignment with the Stadium's workforce restructuring reduction in force plan.

With the decommissioning of the stadium bowl and a significantly reduced facilities staff as a result of the reduction in force, <u>only public access areas are being regularly maintained</u>.

- 1. Maintenance & Facility Items
 - a. Irrigation line repair in Lower Halawa Parking Lot completed in preparation of the 50th State Fair.
 - b. Roadway directional marking and re-striping on main circle road completed.
 - c. Several leaks detected in main chiller identified on 4/11/22 have been repaired and a freon recharge has been completed.

Purpose: Update the Stadium Authority on various activities concerning NASED.

This bill also clarifies the make-up of the Stadium Authority and adds the Director of DBEDT as a voting member of the Stadium Authority board. The intention of this bill is to aggregate enterprise agencies and land management functions under one department. This bill also amends Act 268, SLH 2019, Section 6, to reduce the GO Bond appropriation from \$170M down to \$20M to address existing expenditures and obligations to consultants.
- b) HB1600 Budget bill appropriates \$350M to the Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (BED142) to fund stadium district redevelopment and an additional \$50M, of which \$49.5M is deposited into the Stadium Development Special Fund by Proviso Section 17.3 for the costs of operations, maintenance, and contract costs to developers of the stadium. 2. Financial

In readiness for issuing the RFPs, the project team is updating the financial projections for NASED, including revised real estate project revenues, stadium and district infrastructure costs and the Stadium Authority's operational costs. A driver in the need to update the financial projections is the significant escalation in construction costs since the last analyses were undertaken. The RFP for the stadium project will require proposals to be within a defined "affordability limit" and the state team will seek to ensure that the minimum required scope fits within the financial parameters.

3. Schedule of Key Work-Streams

Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS)

• Due to unforeseen circumstances, publication of the Final PEIS, which was targeted for April 23, 2022, has been held back by the Governor's office until further notice. This presented a reputational issue for the project as letters had already been sent to those that had commented on the Draft PEIS, advising them of the Final PEIS' publication on April 23, 2022. Once published, we will be seeking a notice of acceptance by the Governor that the document is complete and technically adequate. With this acceptance, a 60-day legal challenge period will begin where aggrieved parties may challenge the acceptability of the document in court. Completion of this process provides essential due diligence for future development of the district.

Request for Proposals (RFP's)

• Both the real estate RFP and the stadium RFP are set for release pending final state review and approval.

4. Communication and Public Engagement
