

MONTHLY SECURITY REPORT TO THE BOARD

Brief summary of security related incidents which occurred January 1, 2023, through January 31, 2023.

<u>Theft</u>

On January 15, 2023, at approximately 1:35 p.m., Swap Meet Vendor reported two unknown, young males had purchased some items from Vendor and moved to back of Vendor's Stall to sit on curb and eat. Purpose: Update the Stadium Authority on various activities concerning NASED.

1. Governance

•Regular briefings continue with Governor Green's Administration to provide background related to the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District to ensure the project and delivery methodologies are in alignment with Administration priorities.

•During the January 30, 2023, Star Advertiser Spotlight segment, Governor Green referenced the "impasse" between the House and Senate in their visions for the how the stadium project is completed. He clarified that the House favors using the \$350M to deliver a stadium using a design-build model through the University of Hawaii, and the Senate favors including the entertainment district around the stadium via a public-private partnership. Governor Green further stated that "by the end of the session, they will tell us what they are willing to compromise on. If there's no compromise, I will really only have one choice, and that's to use the \$350M to build a stadium, and then use the public-private partnership for the rest of the land, and that will help us build jobs and housing."

•Memorandum of Agreement (MOA): In progress. As a requirement under Act 220, SLH 2022, a tri-party memorandum of agreement shall be developed between the Department of Business Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT), the Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA), and the Stadium Authority. Proposed responsibilities include Stadium Authority as the landowner with sole jurisdiction over development providing overarching policy for project delivery, DBEDT serving as expending agency and policy advisor for Act 248, SLH 2022, appropriated funds, and HCDA serving as a policy advisor.

2. Financial

•Goldman Sachs, the state's project financial consultant, has been meeting with the Department of Budget and Finance to review the NASED financial projections for the currently proposed Design-Build-Finance-Maintain procurement methodology, as well as for several alternative procurement methodologies.

•The proposed financial approach includes use of the \$350M to leverage development of both a stadium and the surrounding district with the addition of private financing. The financial projections provided to the Stadium Authority in its August meeting by Goldman Sachs showed that despite the significant escalation in construction costs since the prior analyses, as well as the change in funding as provided by Act 248, SLH 2022, the project remains financially feasible with significant projected dividends returned to the state over the 30-year period of study.

3. Schedule of Key Work-Streams

Request for Proposals (RFP's) for both the real estate RFP and the stadium RFP are in active review with the new administration.

BWS also suggested that we consider a regional approach to recycled water and identify potential regional users and demand for recycled water.

 Department of Health's Clean Water Branch and Wastewater Branch to further discuss both measures to
