#### MONTHLY SECURITY REPORT TO THE BOARD

Summary of security related incidents which occurred February 1, 2024, through February 29, 2024.

#### Theft

#### Criminal Property Damage

On February 18, 2024, at approximately 9:58 p.m., a Swap Meet Vendor reported to Sodexo Live that their vehicle had been damaged by a metal pole, while Swap Meet Tent Vendor was breaking down in the afternoon. Swap Meet Vendor's vehicle had a dent on the hood of their vehicle. Honolulu Police Department Report was filed.

#### Swap Meet

Four Medical Assistance calls were reported. All four calls were Injured Cared For (ICF), Trip & Fall. One case, customer tripped on uneven pavement and was injured. Customer was evaluated & treated by Stadium Nurse; customer refused further medical assessment. Customer had a prior injury and was using a cane to walk. One case, elderly customer tripped between Swap Meet tents. Customer was evaluated & treated by Stadium Nurse; customer refused further medical assessment. Customer had a prior injury to affected part of their body. One case, Swap Meet Vendor tripped on a tree root and was injured. Swap Meet Vendor was evaluated & treated by Stadium Nurse; Vendor refused further medical assessment and returned to their Vendor Stall. One case, customer tripped on uneven pavement and was injured. Customer was evaluated & treated by Stadium Nurse; customer refused further medical assessment. Customer had a prior injury and returned to shopping after treatment from Stadium Nurse.
